



Tyntesfield Manor, Wraxall, North Somerset £400k water mains installation project

Background

Tyntsefield House is a magnificent Gothic Revival mansion set in 500 acres of landscaped park and gardens. The estate has numerous farm and estate buildings and a working saw mill.

The existing water supplies from spring sources were below Drinking Water Inspectorate quality standards and the sources were not owned by the Trust. This meant that the Trust had no control over the quality of water or the security of the supply.



Project Description

Pipefix installed and commissioned a new 90mm ring main around the estate to connect all the cottages, farm buildings and the House.

This work was part of an ongoing multi-million pound restoration of the house and estate.

Site Issues

Maintaining safe access for visitors and Trust staff; preservation of site archaeology; protection of trees and wildlife, in particular newts and glow worms.
